As citizens we will:

As musicians we will:

use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes.

As mathematicians we will:

count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number  
count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s  
given a number, identify 1 more and 1 less  
identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.  
Find a half, and a quarter of shapes, objects and quantities.  
Use positional language.

As writers and readers we will:

Spell words containing each of the 40+ phonemes already taught and common exception words.  
Begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place.  
saying out loud what they are going to write about  
composing a sentence orally before writing it  
sequencing sentences to form short narratives  
re-reading what they have written to check that it makes sense  
leaving spaces between words  
beginning to demarcate sentences using capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.

use technology purposefully to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve digital content  
Log on and log off;  
use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about material on the internet or other online technologies
