

As historians we will:

Learn about the life and work of local horticulturist - Alan Titchmarsh.

As geographers we will:

Use geographical language to talk about their local environment.

As musicians we will:

Use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes.

As mathematicians we will:

count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals;
count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s
given a number, identify 1 more and 1 less
identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.
Use positional language including half and quarter turns.
Be able to recognise British coins and notes.
Know the days of the week and the months of the year.
Be able to tell 'o'clock' and 'half past' times.

As writers and readers we will:

Read and spell words accurately using our 40+ sounds from phonics. Read and spell common exception words.

Form letters in the correct direction and starting in the correct place.

Use suffixes -e, -es, -ed, -ing

Read the story of The Amazing Turnip! We will learn to sequence sentences to write a short story.

Then we will write instructions for growing plants.
