Literacy & Communication	<u>A day in the life of a Roman</u> Write a diary about a day in the life of a Roman. You could pretend to be a child, a Roman soldier or a noble person.	<u>Roman Gods</u> Research some information about a Roman god and any myths or stories relating to him or her.	<u>Roman Day</u> Explain how the romans went into battle. What strategies did they use? Etc.
Maths & Problem Solving	<u>Fractions of smarties</u> Out a pack of smarties (or similar), can you find the fraction of each colour and any equivalent fractions.	<u>Find the price</u> Find the price of a carton of milk, a loaf of bread and a pack of 6 eggs. Work out what the change would be from £10.	<u>Finding the perimeter</u> Find the perimeter of somewhere in your house. Could be your bedroom, garden etc.
Science and the Outside Environment	<u>Food diary</u> Make a healthy menu for the week including a varied set of food groups.	<u>Human Body</u> Choose a major organ/ system of the human body and show how it works (e.g. diagrams or texts).	<u>Digestive systems</u> Compare the human digestive system with a cow's digestive system. What is similar and what is different? Use pictures and texts to say what you have found.
Humanities and Citizenship	<u>Romans in our environment</u> Look for evidence of Romans living in our area. Think about buildings, roads and place names.	<u>Roman Empire</u> Draw a map of where the Roman Empire covered.	<u>Research Vesuvius</u> Create a fact sheet about Vesuvius and the eruption during the Roman times.
Creative Arts	<u>Roman artefacts</u> Make your own Roman artefact, e.g. Jewellery, armour, mosaics, coins etc.	<u>Landmarks</u> Draw, sketch or paint important Roman buildings e.g. The Colosseum, the aqueduct- Pont du Gard, temples etc.	<u>Musical Instrument</u> Make your own musical instrument out of junk material. Maybe make a string or a percussion instrument.
