<p>Reading 1</p> <p>Pick 4 words from your book and find out what they mean.</p>	<p>Reading 2</p> <p>Compare a story book and a non-fiction book.</p>	<p>Reading 3</p> <p>Order three events in the story.</p> <p>First...</p> <p>Then...</p> <p>After that...</p>	<p>Reading 4</p> <p>Before you start reading, make a prediction as to what is going to happen in the story. Were you right? What clues did you use?</p>
<p>Maths 1</p> <p>Draw three Superheroes. Measure them using centimetres. How tall are they? Which one is the tallest? Which one is the shortest?</p>	<p>Maths 2</p> <p>Practise doubling and halving numbers to 20.</p>	<p>Maths 3</p> <p>Practise using positional language including left, right, quarter turns, half turns and 3 quarter turns.</p>	<p>Maths 4</p> <p>Practise finding a half and a quarter of different shapes, objects and quantities.</p>
<p>Topic 1</p> <p>Talk about what super powers would people in your family like? Why?</p>	<p>Topic 2</p> <p>Make a collage or painting of people who help us.</p>	<p>Topic 3</p> <p>Write a list of all the things you have done in a week to help at home. What else could you do?</p>	<p>Topic 4</p> <p>Design and make a puppet. It could be a super hero, a fairy tale character or somebody who helps us e.g. a nurse.</p>
