(eg snowy mountain, deep blue sea, tall, wavy grass)</p>	<p>Reading 3</p> <p>Find and read 3 useful signs. What are they for?</p>	<p>Reading 4</p> <p>Find three interesting facts about animals to share with the class.</p>
<p>Maths 1</p> <p>Practise saying the days of the week and the months of the year in the correct order.</p>	<p>Maths 2</p> <p>Find out how many cups it takes to fill a pan? How many jugs does it take? How many spoons? What do you notice about the numbers?</p>	<p>Maths 3</p> <p>Find out how long/tall 5 wild animals are and order these by length.</p>	<p>Maths 4</p> <p>Practise writing numbers to 100. Can you do this not in sequence? What do you notice about 27 and 72?</p>
<p>Topic 1</p> <p>Find out some facts about Charles Darwin.</p>	<p>Topic 2</p> <p>Practise moving around like different animals. What can you pretend to be?</p>	<p>Topic 3</p> <p>Go on a nature walk and look for signs of Spring. What did you see?</p>	<p>Topic 4</p> <p>Design and make a fruit or vegetable animal.</p>
